Higher Education

Post-graduation, apprentices will be able to enroll in higher education courses aligned with their industry pathway.

Industry Credentials

Apprentices are required to pursue an industry credential to develop practical knowledge and skills.

On the Job Training

Each apprentice will develop career-ready, indemand competencies through their employer. These skills are designed to have currency in the job-market, and to set up apprentices for future career success.
